Sheila Kirk has written the following tribute to Linda Cox.

Linda died on the morning of 1st December 2011, in Oxford NZ hospital, convalescing from heart surgery. Her husband David (ex Sebright School) died the same afternoon in Christchurch Hospital, New Zealand as a reslult of pancreatic cancer. Linda leaves a son and daughter, plus her mother Irene Hoedemakers, formerly Mann née Shutt, also a former pupil of K.H.S. and now in her 90s. Linda also had a younger sister who travelled to New Zealand for the funeral. Other Old Girls living in the area, namely Jenny James (née Oakes) and Diana Gooseman(née Slater) represented the School at the funeral. Linda and David emigrated following their marriage and set up their first home in Christchurch, though David left almost immediately, leaving behind a very pregnant Linda as he was in the Merchant Navy. He spent many years travelling the world. Linda will be sadly missed by many people. She was always very proud of having been a scholar at K.H.S. and still had many old exercise books, reports, magazines etc. She had been an OGA member for a number of years. In New Zealand she was well known and respected in many circles, especially among Wool Spinners and Weavers. She recently served on the National Board of this organisation, representing South Canterbury. During her period of office she organised the Area Conferences held at various venues mostly on the South Island and also attended the North Island events on behalf of South Canterbury. She was a competent speaker. Be assured she did K.H.S. proud. Linda's mother, Irene, emigrated to New Zealand some years ago. She is now physically frail but mentally alert, still an expert Scrabble player. When we visited in March she beat us hollow. Linda was her carer for the past few years and will be sorely missed. Very shortly after Linda's death, Irene contacted Jenny James asking her to let me know the sad news. Her wish was for me to pass on the information to former school contacts. I took it upon myself to ask Jenny to represent us at the funeral and where appropriate to put forward messages of condolence on our behalf. I am sending a sympathy card to Irene who must be quite devastated.

Mary is going to visit New Zealand to see her sister in Hamilton(North Island) and many friends she made during the five years when she lived in various places on both islands. Diana is still in close contact with Phyllis Hudson who keeps her up to date with what is happening here. She is godmother to her eldest son, Michael, who lives in Huddersfield.

I was then employed by Wyre Forest District Council where I spent many years in the Human Resources Division; my position was PA/HR Assistant. In my spare time I have achieved qualifications in holistic therapies and beauty. My husband and I are celebrating our 25th Wedding Anniversary this August. We have raised two wonderful children, Katherine who has just qualified in Photography with a BA honours, and Gareth whose just completed his GCSEs and is hoping to go on to college to study Graphic Design. From the Archives

The following is an extract from a copy of the Kidderminster Shuttle Diamond Day Supplement from 24th May 1957.

Young Kidderminster clarinettist, Peggy Summers of Chester Road South was the only local member of the Birmingham School of Music Orchestra which played for the Queen in the Town Hall. (Her mother was organist at St George's Church where her father was the churchwarden).

Linda Perkins (née Griffiths), who attended K.H.S. from 1968 to 1975, sent the following report about being inspired to take Latin to the next generation. I have always loved Latin (and Greek) and first became inspired at school by a fantastic inspirational Latin teacher and carried on with Greek at Birmingham University inspired by an amazing lecturer. I was determined to pass on my love of classics to the next generation because I know, if Latin and Greek are taught properly, they are fabulous subjects. My first opportunity came when I became Deputy Headteacher at St James's in Wollaston. I began a Latin Club for gifted children in Year 6. I got to know Barbara Bell of 'Minimus' fame and together we started the club. I attended Barbara's training courses and took advantage of a grant which helps provide financial help for people who want to set up Latin groups in State Schools. We had a wonderful time for 2 years, entering competitions using podcasts, design technology ideas and the Internet. Roman and Greek stories are a real hit with the children. I then moved to be Headteacher at St Mary's in Kingswinford. I set up a Latin Club, but this time for the whole of Year 6 with taster sessions to inspire Year 5. Again Barbara inspired the children with her visit and I advertised for a person to run the club. I met Kate who now teaches a whole morning in Year 6 weekly. It is wonderful to see how the children's language skills have improved as a result of learning Latin in a really enjoyable way. We have provided master-classes for local primary schools who have loved it too! I am really glad that parts of the media are now reporting that the teaching of classics is a good idea, because I think in the past it has had a bit of bad press with people saying it is elitist and no use at all in the modern world. It is when you see a child who has never heard of Latin shine in the subject which is amazing. Children also never spell words like 'audio' and 'video' incorrectly again. And it is such a bonus if children want to be linguists or join the medical or legal professions. With the advent of digital media, Latin is accessible to everyone.

Long may it continue!
